Those Special Among Us

Noel left Mexico as a fourteen-year-old boy with a fourth grade education and very low reading skills. Knowing no one, he came to California in 1982 and started working as a field worker in the San Joaquin Valley. After a short time, he moved to North San Luis Obispo County. He found out about the Literacy Council for San Luis Obispo County from the lady he worked for as a barn cleaner. She took him to one of our learning centers and helped him sign up to learn to read, write and speak English. He needed to get a driver's license and wanted to become a US Citizen. The big obstacles for Noel in becoming a reader were fatigue from having to work all day at a physically strenuous job, lack of transportation and growing family responsibilities. He reached the goal of becoming a reader by having tutors that cared. Noel missed few tutor sessions and also studied at home. He forced himself to go out to conduct everyday living chores, like grocery shopping and banking so that he could do them right without embarrassment. His English has improved so much that now he is interpreting at church services and is a tutor for the Literacy Council. He has spoken to various clubs and groups to share his story as a learner. He has been successful in attaining a driver's license, becoming a US Citizen, and passing the GED. He owns a landscape business with one employee. Because of his improving English language



skills, Noel is more confident in social situations and able to more easily meet people and go everywhere without fear. He is a better parent because he can read in English to his three children. He attends parent/teacher conferences and communicates with his children about their schoolwork. He can interact with his children's friends and their friends' parents and can be actively involved in his children's activities such as basketball and karate. He is confident to pursue interests such as playing Andean music on the panpipes and learning computer skills. Noel continues to set goals with aspirations for more education and increased job opportunities. We're so grateful to Noel for being such an inspiration.

Meanwhile, at the other end of the county, Margaret van Wyngaarden is having success in re-establishing our Paso Robles center. She is desperate for tutors as more students are walking in the door every session. We appreciate Margaret's pursuit of both learners and tutors. If any of you know of potential tutors for the north county area, please send them our way!

Cambria is transformed. That quiet little center is also expanding rapidly. Suddenly many new learners are seeking our services and Sherry Eiselen, our center director in Cambria, is recruiting tutors as fast as she can. We have appreciated the willingness of those interested in tutoring in Cambria to travel the many miles necessary to join our training sessions in Paso Robles and

San Luis Obispo.

We have a small center at St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Morro Bay in addition to our larger Morro Bay center at St. Timothy's Church. Tutor Peggy Elliot served as interim center director for the St. Peter's center this spring. We thank her for taking on that job. We are looking for a new, permanent center director for that center. The center at St. Timothy's Church is thriving under the guidance of Jerry Hannula.

We had 23 people train in Arroyo Grande in August. Center director Carol Dykstra sent around a dozen potential tutors our way for that training. Outstanding work, Carol! In our September training, we added seven additional tutors. We thank all of our tutors for taking the time to go through the training!

All those in our other centers are continuing to make excellent progress. We thank everyone for all of their hard work.

We have training sessions scheduled in October – the 16th and 23rd in Paso Robles, November 6th and 13th in SLO and December 4th and 11th also in SLO. Spread the word!

It was very nice to see some of you at our annual volunteer recognition event in September- International Literacy Month. Jack Beigle is a very worthy recipient of the bi-annual Jan Breidenbach award. Along with certificates for all who attended, we had wonderful raffle prizes, such as tickets to the SLO Rotary Home tour. Plans are to make next year's event even better- so make sure you come.

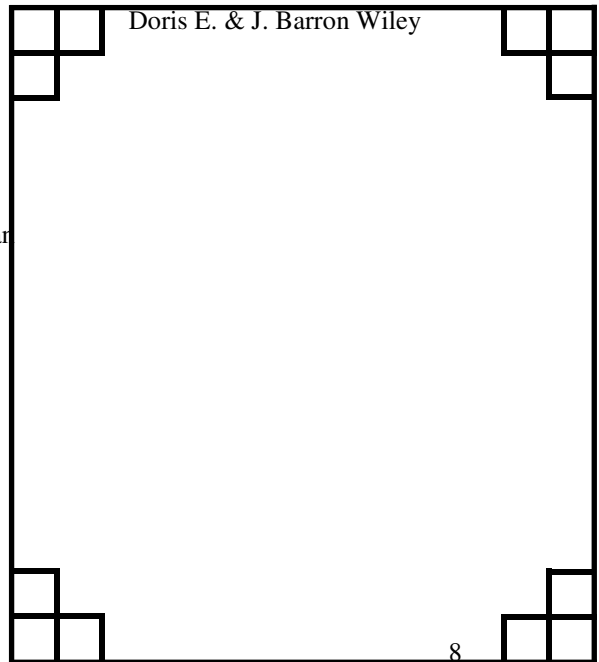
